Educators at LEAD Burpengary believe all children learn through play, songs, music, reading, routines, games and activities. By watching and learning through many different experiences and intentional teaching.

Educators at LEAD are positive role models who alongside the children help them learn and grow. While being aware of each child's needs extending on their interest through scaffolding and intentional teaching. Creating exciting environments interactive for the children to extend on their learning in safe, secure and supported settings.

Parents are welcomed at the centre at any time, we have an open door policy, and the open door policy invites the parents to take part in their child's learning at any time throughout the day. Invitations are sent to Parents upon enrolment to join Storypark. Storypark is a living document and allows educators and parents to communicate throughout the day. Communication with families on a daily basis through community posts, weekend sheet, feedback and daily interaction during morning drop off times and evening pick up times.

LEAD Burpengary educators are inclusive and invite all cultures and beliefs with open arms. Within our LEAD community we are many coming from backgrounds such as Indonesia, New Zealand, South Africa, Samoan and Cook Islands. Various Educators have experienced extensive travel and have lived in different countries, this gathers an understanding of different cultures which we invite into our centre.

Educators in the LEAD family wish to pay respect to their Elder's past, present and emerging. Acknowledging the important role Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people continue to play within the LEAD community and the community beyond.
